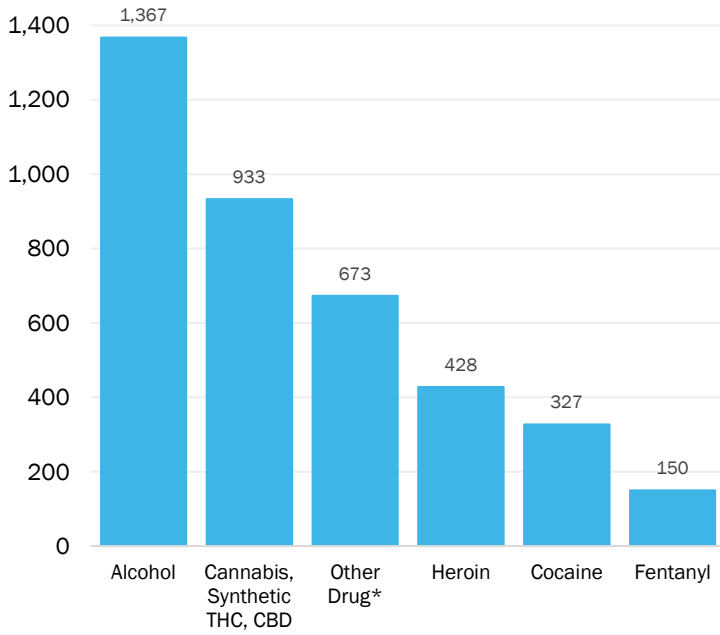


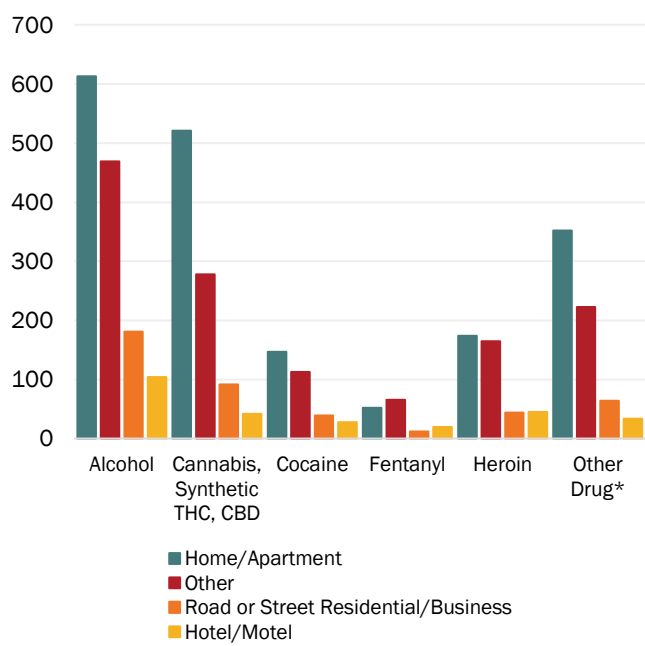
Suspected or Confirmed Drug(s) Taken by Patient: What can we learn?

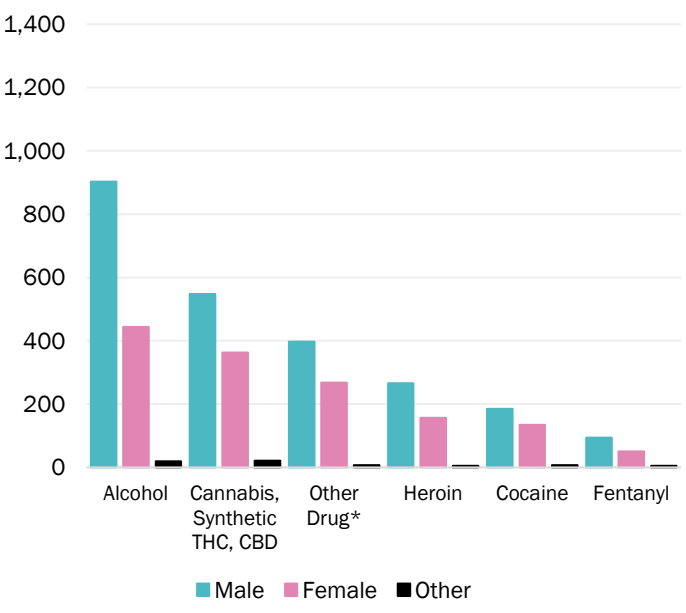
Most Common Responses



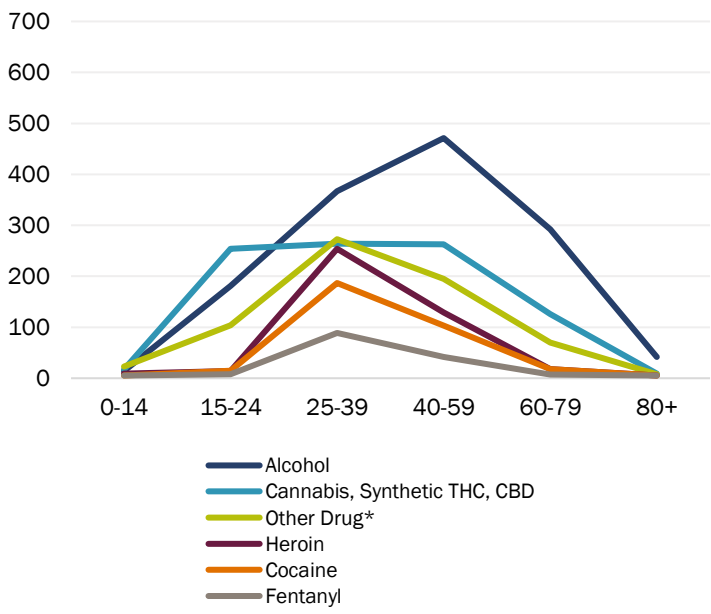
Location Types
