

SPEAKERS

David Mee-Lee, M.D., Board-certified psychiatrist, ASAM-certified addiction medicine specialist, Chief editor of the ASAM Patient Placement Criteria, Senior advisor to The Change Companies
David Mee-Lee is a board-certified psychiatrist, and is certified by examination of the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM). He trains and consults both nationally and internationally. Dr. Mee-Lee is Chief Editor of the Revised Second Edition of the ASAM Criteria. He is also a Senior Advisor to The Change Companies. Dr. Mee-Lee has over thirty years experience in person centered treatment and program development for people with co-occurring mental health and substance use conditions.

Jody Kamon, Ph.D.

Jody Kamon is a licensed psychologist with Evidence Based Solutions, LLC and a Program Evaluator in the Department of Pediatrics at the University of Vermont. She is examining the effectiveness of Vermont systems of care in helping youth with co-occurring problems, ages 16 – 21, transition successfully to adulthood. Her other roles include serving as a state and national consultant and trainer on implementation of evidence based practices, motivational interviewing, CBT, family engagement, and adolescent brain development and substance use. Her clinical work to date has focused on children, adolescents and families with mental health and substance abuse problems. Her research has included intervention trials for adolescent co-occurring disorders and outcomes of children of drug dependent parents.

Patrick DeChello, Ph.D., LCSW, M.S.W., RPH, is the founder and senior partner of D & S Associates, an international training and consulting company serving the mental health and substance abuse treatment fields. He is an internationally renowned author (25 books to date) with over 25 years experience in training, consultation, and direct care. He is highly sought out for his expertise, experience, humor and energy that make his presentations informative, educational and highly enjoyable.

Lou Traficante, Ph.D. has been the Laboratory Director for Willow Laboratories and Medical Center in Lynn, MA. since 1998. Dr. Traficante's educational background is in Biochemistry, Toxicology, and Neuropharmacology. He received his Ph.D. at Rutgers University in New Jersey and did his postdoctoral work at the New York University Medical Center and Bellevue Psychiatric hospital in New York where his work focused on brain receptor pharmacology of neuroleptic drugs and preferential metabolic pathways in schizophrenia. In 1993, his interest focused on the medico-legal aspects of pharmacology and toxicology and worked closely with several large law firms as an expert. Since then, he has devoted his life in the field of Forensic Toxicology with specialty in its application to addictive disorders. In 2006, he became board certified in Forensic Toxicology by the American Board of Forensic Toxicologists. Dr. Traficante is the author and co-author of over 40 national and international publications (including tape cassettes and books) in the field of drug and alcohol metabolism. He has designed and facilitated training's and workshops on numerous topics relating to drug testing for drug courts, drug treatment facilities, and social service organizations, as well as, training for lawyers and judges. He routinely provides expert testimony in local, state, and Federal courts.

Punyamurtula Kishore M.D., M.P.H., Medical Director

Preventive Medicine Associates, Brookline, MA
Dr. Punyamurtula Kishore has been a practicing public health scientist for over 30 years. He began his medical career as a primary care/family practice physician and then moved into a position as the Medical Director of the Washingtonian Center for Addiction, the first organization in the U.S. to recognize addiction as a disease. Their philosophy was an early precursor to the AA or 12-step program movement. Dr. Kishore has been a member of the American Society of Addiction Medicine since 1986 and has helped treat more than 140,000 addicts. Dr. Kishore served as a faculty member of Harvard and as an Assistant Professor of Medicine at the University of Massachusetts. He holds his Master's Degree in Public Health from Harvard School of Public Health, in addition to Certificates in Addiction Studies and Forensic Psychology from Bridgewater State College.

Claudia Black, Ph.D. is a renowned addiction author, speaker and trainer internationally recognized for her pioneering and contemporary work with family systems and addictive disorders. Claudia Black holds a Doctorate of Philosophy in Social Psychology from Columbia Pacific University, and a Masters Degree in Social Work and Bachelor of Arts Degree in Social Welfare from the University of Washington. She is a Clinical Consultant for The Meadows Treatment Center in Wickenburg, Arizona; she serves on the Advisory Board for the National Association of Children of Alcoholics, and the Advisory Council of the Moyer Foundation.

Mark McGovern, M.D.

Dr. McGovern is an Associate Professor of Psychiatry and of Community and Family Medicine at Dartmouth Medical School. He joined Dartmouth in 2001 after 15 years on the faculty of the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Northwestern University Medical School in Chicago, Illinois. He began his professional career as a counselor in an inner city detoxification program in North Philadelphia in 1978. Dr. McGovern specializes in the treatment of co-occurring substance use and psychiatric disorders and practices through the Department of Psychiatry at Dartmouth Hitchcock Medical Center. He has studied and published widely in the area of addiction treatment services research. He has conducted treatment research in a variety of settings including addiction treatment programs, community mental health centers, state psychiatric hospitals, academic medical centers, office-based practices, private specialty treatment programs and state addiction and mental health treatment delivery systems. In July of 2004, he received a 5-year career development award from the National Institute on Drug Abuse. The overarching goal of this award involves developing, testing and transferring evidence-based treatments to community settings for persons with co-occurring substance use and psychiatric disorders.

Driving Directions:


