

Point of Distribution (POD)

Where is my closest POD?

The closest POD should not be more than a few miles from you. Dial 2-1-1 or go to www.healthvermont.gov to find directions to the nearest POD.

What can I expect at a POD?

At the POD you will be asked to fill out a screening form for you and each person in your household. This form asks general medical questions. The form will let POD staff know which kind of medication each member of your family should get. You will also be told how to take the medication so that it will work.

There may be a line at the POD. Please be patient. There will be enough medication for everyone who needs it.

What do I need to bring to the POD?

You do not need to bring ID.

Only ONE person from each household should go to the POD. This person should bring the following information:

- How many people you are picking up medicine for?
- How many of these people are children?
- What are the ages / heights / weight of these children?
- Is anyone in your household pregnant or breastfeeding?
- Medical information about each person in your household:
- Allergies of each person (especially to Ciprofloxacin or Doxycycline)
- Chronic illnesses of each person

Can I bring my children to the POD?

To keep crowds at the POD small and manageable, if possible please leave your children with a trusted person looking after them. You can pick up enough medication for your children and everyone in your household.
