Potassium Iodide (KI)

As part of Vermont's continuing preparedness effort, one dose of potassium iodide is being made available to each person who lives or works within Brattleboro, Dummerston, Guilford, Halifax, Marlboro and Vernon for use in the event of a Vermont Yankee Nuclear Power Station radiological emergency.

Participation in this program is voluntary.

- Potassium iodide is a safe and effective method to protect the thyroid gland from radioactive iodine in the event of a nuclear release. Children are particularly vulnerable to radioactive iodines.
- Used at the proper dosage and time, potassium iodide is safe for most people. Anyone who has an existing thyroid condition or allergy to iodine or shellfish should consult with his or her health care provider.
- Potassium iodide is not a substitute for evacuation and other protective actions. Evacuation may be the most effective action in a radiological emergency.

By completing and submitting this application:

- I verify that I live or work in Brattleboro, Dummerston, Guilford, Halifax, Marlboro or Vernon.
- I agree to receive potassium iodide from the Vermont Department of Health.
- I verify that I am the parent or legal guardian of a child or children for whom I am requesting potassium iodide.
- I assume full responsibility for using potassium iodide pills and for replacing them when they expire.
