Note: Vermont EMS in conjunction with the VT Ambulance Association asked this information of their licensed ambulance services. Per capita subsidy is described as the total number of dollars paid to support an ambulance service by a town or city, divided by the population of the town or city. Per capita subsidy includes payments made in the form of contributions, contracts, town meeting allocations, or other transaction forms that result in a direct payment to the ambulance service by a town or city where the ambulance service provides 911 coverage. The figure does not include items such as separate funding paid in support of a first response service, in-kind funding estimates, or funding specifically paid for fire protection services.
