# 2017 BE TICK SMART





#### **Purpose**

Participation in the *Be Tick Smart High School Video Contest* provides students with an opportunity to learn about health and science while they build writing and technical skills. Working individually or in teams, students are asked to produce a 30-second public service announcement (PSA) that focuses on educating Vermonters about tickborne disease prevention.

Staff from the Vermont Department of Health (VDH) will judge video submissions based on creativity, accuracy of educational information and production quality. Individual students or teams who create the top three winning videos will receive prizes and will be featured on the Health Department's website. (All videos will be posted on the Health Department website, and some may run on local television stations.)

1<sup>st</sup> prize is worth up to \$200 2<sup>nd</sup> prize is worth up to \$100 3<sup>rd</sup> prize is worth up to \$50

### **Eligibility**

Students in grades 9 - 12, including homeschoolers who are currently residing in the state of Vermont are eligible to participate in the 2017 Be Tick Smart High School Video Contest.

#### **Rules & Guidelines**

- One entry per individual or team will be accepted. Submission deadline is April 3, 2017.
- All contest entries must be original work created by the student participant(s).
   Teachers may provide guidance/direction to students but must not participate or feature in the production of the video entry.
- Videos must conform to the PSA format, and must be as close to 30-seconds (without going over) in length. Refer to the PSA Guidelines on the website healthvermont.gov and search: Be Tick Smart video contest.
- Only videos with content deemed appropriate for the public will be accepted. No gratuitous sex, violence, profane language or other offensive material will be accepted.

- Videos must not highlight products, labels or corporate names. Product labels should be covered.
- All videos must comply with copyright regulations.
- All video submissions will become the property of the Vermont Department of Health. Videos will be uploaded to the Vermont Department of Health YouTube channel.

- Any violation of the guidelines/rules will result in disqualification of the video.

#### Criteria

Videos will be judged based on the following criteria:

- **Direction:** how successful is the individual/team at incorporating the video guidelines?
- Creativity and Originality: how creative/innovative are the ideas presented in the video? Does the video convey the message in such a way that the audience can connect to it?
- **Accuracy**: how accurate is the information about ticks and Lyme disease?
- Production Quality: Are the visuals easy to see, and is the dialogue (audio) easy to hear?

#### **Topics and Reference Material for Tickborne disease Prevention**

#### Required messages:

- Use insect repellant and wear protective clothing
- Perform daily tick checks
- Remove ticks promptly
- Watch for symptoms of tickborne disease

## **Examples of Other Possible Topics**

- What is a tickborne disease?
- Who is at risk of getting tickborne disease in Vermont?
- What are some common symptoms of tickborne disease?
- What is a good tick habitat?
- Where are deer ticks most likely to be encountered?
- How does the deer tick life cycle play a role in the transmission of tickborne disease?
