Thought it would be valuable to bring stakeholders around the table to have a discussion on what you are seeing in community and what would be valuable and implementing a system. We need your expertise and guidance to help draft recommendations for a state-wide system and participate in the implementation and evaluation of system.</p> <p data-bbox="703 784 1965 987">Substance Abuse prevention coalitions have been working on Takeback day for some time now. The first Takeback day was by the Burlington group back in 2012. In 2014 it was a priority for the Governor and Act 75 was passed. Pieces of that bill directed the VT Dept. of Health and Dept. of Public Safety to provide recommendations about a design and implementation of a volunteer state drug disposal system. A report issued from health dept./public safety with several recommendations such as: drop boxes, mail back options, elements MDS, LE pickup.</p> <p data-bbox="703 1034 1965 1201">The Health Dept. started working on VT Most Dangerous Leftovers campaign with Vermont Prescription Drug Abuse workgroup. Health Dept. has a new grant named Regional Prevention Partnerships0 RPP – one of goals is to address Rx drug abuse and misuse - must participate in all Takeback days also allowed to take some of the money and use to purchase drop boxes, educating physicians about addictive properties of Rx medications.</p> <p data-bbox="703 1248 1965 1308">Act 173 – hire a staff person to develop a state-wide system, also money for media campaign and mail back system.</p>

Surveyed the 10 Prevention Consultants in 12 health districts –for knowledge and community partner’s knowledge of community response.  Results are not comprehensive and Lots of detail to still be gathered:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 59 disposal distinct methods identified</li> <li>• Most are LE agency</li> <li>• Pharmacies (some not for controlled substance)</li> <li>• Overlay the Gaps-Assets-Barriers</li> </ul> <p>Maria Sanderson, director of Burlington Partnership for Healthy Community is also working on Mapping in Chittenden County - 13 places in Chittenden County that do drug take back also places that do also shows sites that don’t. Applied for grant for someone to research and put together all the information on increase access. Position to start in January, still Chittenden county focus but would be trying to find out what barriers and challenges for LE and pharmacies that could be disposal sites and making recommendations and research what is going on nationally.</p> <p>Sam Francis – Chittenden County Opioid Alliance also working on mapping.</p>
			Pilot program	<p>Sheriff Marcoux was involved in the initial set up for DEA takeback</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Pilot project – A pilot program was discussed with a local Sheriff – his dept. would collect the drugs from other law enforcement depts. around the state and store them in a secure facility to utilize the incineration resources and coordinate with DEA.</li> <li>• Cannot pick up from pharmacies</li> <li>• Mail take back drugs – will have address in Lamoille for people to mail back then it would go into the secure facility.</li> </ul>

				<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• One barrier for LE is housing the drugs within the evidence locker</li> <li>• Cost with disposing medication – closest incinerator is NH</li> <li>• Utilize DEA takeback days.</li> <li>• 14 sheriff depts. within the state – central contact for DEA for takeback.</li> <li>• How do we fold in pharmacies into this pilot program?</li> <li>• Need creative ways to utilize resources within to help pharmacies and hospitals with pharmacies by providing grant funding in order to dispose medication</li> <li>• RPP has funds for purchase of dropbox – Need to figure out ongoing maintenance cost.</li> <li>• Medsafe – no upfront cost just cost for liners – 3 per year – total \$970.00 year and 3-year min contract.</li> <li>• MedX – purchase box but pharmacy responsible for disposal</li> <li>• Reverse distribution – a bid for whole state</li> <li>• Survey pharmacy on what they would prefer</li> </ul>
