How to Catch up on Missing Immunizations to Meet Vermont's Child Care and School Requirements

Vermont's Immunization Rule, adopted pursuant to 18 V.S.A. § 1123, requires that before entry, children/students must have all required immunizations unless exempt for medical or religious reasons.

Children/students without all doses of required vaccines may be provisionally admitted without an exemption if the child/student has a scheduled appointment to receive the missing vaccine(s), consistent with the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)</u> <u>catch-up immunization schedule</u>.

The catch-up schedule for children/students starting late or missing doses of vaccine is specific to the age at which vaccination begins, the history of any previously received doses, and follows guidance for catch-up timing from the CDC. Shots received years ago count and do not need to be repeated. Alternate or delayed vaccination schedules are not acceptable.

The Provisional Admittance section of the <u>Notice of Missing Immunizations form</u> must be signed by a health care provider and submitted by the parent/guardian to the child care program or school upon entry. The period of provisional admittance may not exceed six months. Long term provisional admittance is not allowed.
