When Cold Weather Puts You at Risk



Below 31°F: Don't stay outside too long. These temperatures can cause frostbite and hypothermia, especially if you're not dressed warmly.

Below 13°F: Avoid going outside if possible. In extreme cold, your body loses heat quickly, and even a short time outside can be dangerous.

Who Is Most at Risk in Cold Weather?



Older Adults and Young Children: Their bodies lose heat quickly, making them more likely to get sick or hurt in the cold.

People Without Proper Clothing: Without enough warm layers, like coats, hats, and gloves, frostbite and hypothermia can happen quickly.

People Without Shelter or Heat: Those without a warm place to stay or who can't afford heat are at a higher risk of cold-related injuries and illnesses.

Cold-Related Illness in Bennington County



Highest Rates in Vermont: Bennington County has the highest rate of cold-related illnesses in the state, with more cases of frostbite, hypothermia, and other cold-weather injuries than any other county.

Why it Matters: Long, harsh winters, limited resources, and financial challenges may contribute to these higher rates, making it especially important to stay informed and prepared.


Cold Weather Impact: Key Data and Charts




Rates of Cold-Related Illness per County
