They also have the right to inspect and copy information as set forth in 26 V.S.A. §§ 1371, 1372, to examine such documentary evidence as may be produced against them, and to request to depose witnesses by motion to the Board or hearing officer as provided by 26 V.S.A. § 1371(c). A record of the proceeding will be kept.
