Easier access to cannabis could increase rates of use in young adults

Of the 1 in 5 young adults (ages 18-25) who answered that having retail cannabis stores in Vermont will change their cannabis use, 65% responded they will start to use or increase their use of cannabis.



Of young adults (ages 18-25) in Vermont, nearly half (45%) said they used cannabis in the past 30 days. Almost half of those (46%) used cannabis 20 or more days in the past 30 days.

Changes in other states with recreational cannabis legalization



Compared to states without recreational cannabis legalization, in states with recreational cannabis legalization:

- In youth (age 12-17) there was an increase in cannabis use disorder
- In adults (26+) there was an increase in frequent cannabis use and cannabis use disorder
