I need to focus my time on the work that I am shepherding for the Windsor Health Service area in our community.</li> <li>Melanie's position is an appointed position by the governor's office. All those on this committee are appointed into your respective roles because it was deliberately designed to represent key sectors of this work. <ul> <li>We do need to identify a new vice chair. A portion of those funds will be utilized to implement vending machines for Narcan® throughout the state. VDH is using a rigorous analysis and process and trying to make it build on past experience of other states and cities that have integrated these machines are part of their overdose prevention strategy.</li> </ul>
Opioid Settlement Meeting Reflection	Melanie Sheehan	<ul> <li>Presentation provided to the Opioid Settlement Committee on the prevention proposal can be found here</li> <li>As a reminder to the committee, primary prevention is being a part of that full continuum.</li> <li>Melanie: <ul> <li>We consulted with prevention works and Mentor VT and looked at what our prevention gaps were, which is mainly geographical with significant geographical gaps in SAP's embedded in schools in VT. That was a key part of the presentation and Traci Sawyer's was able to share the metrics around that and what our school-based funding is currently supporting. We looked at the in school supports and out of school supports and how we need to build that resilience with kids and connection.</li> <li>When we introduce the concept of prevention as it impacts the children and their families at the family level, prevention is very key – there was passion around it too, but really informed by the work that's been happening</li> <li>Melanie feels they were heard, and prevention was well represented in the meeting. Monica was there to lend her support as the Chief Prevention officer.</li> <li>This proposal was focused on younger people and the information provided was grounded in data, strategies that we know work. DSU and Prevention Works VT did a nice job linking back to the data from the YRBS to the Social Autopsy Report while at the same time looking at harm reduction, intervention and treatment.</li> </ul> </li> <li>The committee does not have an actual monetary number at this time, but not all of the money</li> </ul>

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		has been deposited this year.  • The committee will meet again next week to hear a bunch of other proposals and then prior to the new year, be able to weigh in on how they would like us to proceed

She is also developing a 1 pager around the correlations between alcohol advertising and potential youth use. Moving forward into the legislative session, Alex is going to keep an eye where things are at as well as educating the community whether they be prevention, coalitions, organizations or interested in helping reach their local legislatures, or potentially talking, giving testimony, writing briefs, providing information on how to connect with your legislature, a timeline for what to do and when, a toolkit to help tie up the loose ends for folks

		<ul> <li>Reflecting on Roy's presentation and the partnership that prevention had with the Cannabis Control Broad, there is discussion about trying to move forward some more regulation around D8 and D9 due to hemp growers marketing as hemp products that have high enough level of THC to be psychoactive.</li> <li>Those hemp products do not fall under the cannabis rules, so the Cannabis Control Board is going to be trying to control and close that loop.</li> <li>This is a place where we can partner and have conversations around those things and be able to pull out an immediate response or an immediate strategy, where are some unlikely partnerships that we should be building and promoting and are there any policies that we want to see kind of promoted</li> </ul>

The key elements of this structure are regional assessment and strategic planning, the fiscal management and sub-granting; an overarching goal is to sustain existing substance misuse prevention coalitions, to build additional prevention capacity, and to reach gap areas to ensure statewide prevention coverage in all 12 health districts</li> <li>Started July 1 this year and is a six month start up and the VPLO will being the broader sub granting in their region starting on Jan 1.</li> <li>Benefits of the approach expands and strengthens our substance misuse prevention system with flexible increased in sustainable dollars. This is specifically the \$3 Millon that has been</li> </ul>
