You First pays for and connects eligible Vermonters to breast and cervical cancer screenings and diagnostic tests. Members ages 35-64 can get heart health screenings and free memberships to local gyms, farmers' market coupons, state park passes, home blood pressure monitoring equipment, and more.

Our Patient Navigator guides members from screening to diagnosis to treatment. The Lifestyle Program Coordinator & Health Coach helps members achieve their fitness and nutrition goals for better heart health. You First provides 90-day retroactive coverage from the application signature date.

You First is a program of the Vermont Department of Health and is grant funded through the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

January is Cervical Cancer Awareness Month!

January is Cervical Cancer Awareness Month. It's a great time to talk to patients about cervical cancer screening tests (Pap/HPV testing) and HPV vaccination. Cervical cancer is one of the few cancers that can be prevented. Screening is recommended for folks with a cervix between ages 21 and 65. Most people can get cervical cancer screening every 3 to 5 years, but those who have had an abnormal result will likely get screened more frequently.

As a provider, you can remind patients when their next cancer screenings are due. You can also connect patients to the You First program for more support in getting cervical cancer screening, such as help setting up appointments or providing transportation to appointments. You First can pay for Pap and HPV tests for eligible Vermonters, including screenings and diagnostics that occurred up to 90 days before joining the program. Plus, if cancer is found, You First can help many members enroll in a special insurance program that covers cervical cancer treatment.

Most cases of cervical cancer are caused by the human papillomavirus (HPV). HPV is a very common virus that can lead to multiple types of cancer, but the HPV vaccine can prevent the virus. This vaccine is available for people ages 9-45 of all genders, and it is recommended that children have this vaccine at ages 11-12. Encourage people you serve to discuss the HPV vaccine with their health care provider for themselves and for the children in their lives.

While cervical cancer is preventable, unfortunately, people die from cervical cancer each year. In the U.S., cervical cancer rates are highest among Hispanic people, while death rates are highest among Black people. Focusing on cervical cancer screening and HPV vaccination is an important priority for Vermont's You First program. You First supports Vermonters who have barriers to accessing care, including lack of insurance, high out-of-pocket costs, transportation, and knowledge about the importance of these screening tests.

2024 Program Updates

Heart Health Grant Renewed

Vermont's You First program is excited to announce that we received another 5-year grant from the CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention) to continue our heart health program. The new grant started on October 1 and comes with a few changes to the heart health program. One of the biggest changes is that the age range for the heart health portion of the program is 35-64 (it previously was 30-64).

To participate, members need to have their blood pressure, cholesterol, and blood sugar measured on October 1, 2023 or later and have the results sent to You First. They also need to fill out and mail in the Heart Health Questionnaire sent in their enrollment packet. After You First has received the screening results and answers to the questions, our health coach and dietician, Siobhan, will be in touch to support them with reaching their heart health goals.
