

# **Adults with Disabilities: Population in Focus Report**

Vermont Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS), 2023

December 2025



#### **Introduction – Adults with Disabilities**

This report focuses on health-related factors and behaviors experienced by adults who self-reported having any disability and adults who reported having no disability, compared to the overall statewide rate.

The Vermont Department of Health acknowledges that data presented in this report are driven by complex upstream factors, including social, economic, and environmental inequities. Data on the prevalence of certain indicators may be influenced by differences in age distribution across disability status. We are continually working to further incorporate information highlighting the social determinants of health and informed by the communities and partners we seek to serve.

In the 2023 BRFSS, disability indicators included serious difficulty with one or more of the following:

- · walking or climbing stairs,
- · concentrating or making decisions,
- hearing,
- seeing,
- dressing or bathing,
- or because of a physical, mental, or emotional condition having difficulty doing errands alone.

Overall, in 2023, 28% of Vermonters reported having any disability.

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#### Methodology

The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) is a telephone survey conducted annually among adults aged 18 and older. The Vermont BRFSS is completed by the Vermont Department of Health in collaboration with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). All U.S. states, Washington D.C., and most U.S. territories participate in the BRFSS. BRFSS surveys are completed by approximately 7,000 adults each year, from across the state. Completion of the BRFSS depends on a participant's ability to independently complete an over-the-phone survey with a personal cellphone or on a landline phone in a private residence. Adults who are incarcerated, living in group housing, without a personal phone, or who have hearing impairments or other physical, emotional, or cognitive disabilities that preclude their ability to independently complete such a survey may not be adequately represented in this data. Results are weighted to be representative of the entire adult population.

Throughout this report, all estimates reported represent percentages. To ensure statistical reliability and decrease instances of data suppression, estimates represent the average of 2 years of data combined. Statistical significance is calculated by comparing the 95% confidence intervals of two or more values. A 95% confidence interval is a range of values and can vary due to the size of a particular population or how consistently participants responded to an item. All comparisons are made to the overall statewide estimate, and statistically significant differences are noted. Sometimes, when comparing the responses of two or more groups, the overall percentage may look very different, but the two numbers are not statistically different. Other times, the two values may be very close but differ statistically. While this report notes statistical differences, we encourage you to consider meaningful differences: does the disparity merit a targeted intervention, show a real change in health, or otherwise mean something important to the community (statistics aside).
