Adults who use e-cigarettes, have Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD), or are Indigenous have the highest cigarette smoking rates.

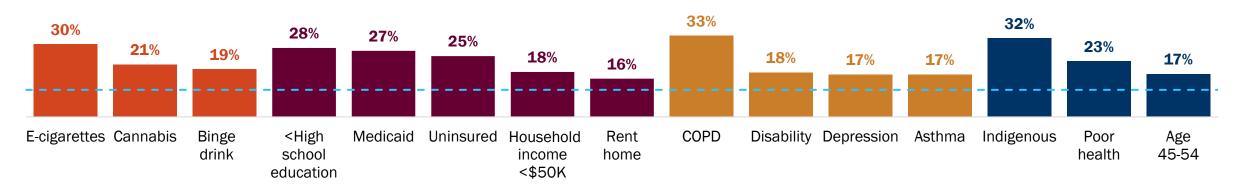

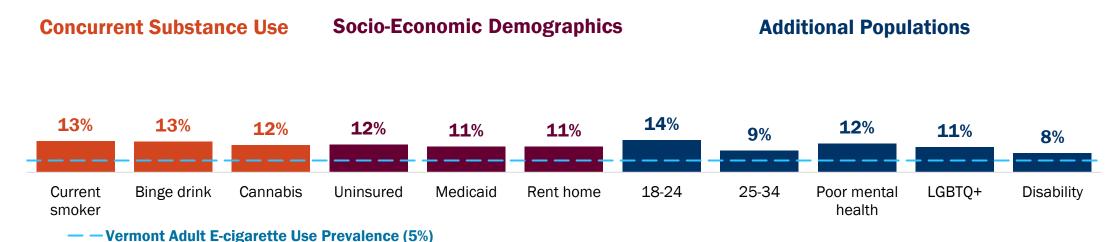

Data Notes

- **E-cigarettes** refer to electronic cigarettes and other electronic vaping products, including e-hookahs, vape pens, e-cigars and others.
- Current cannabis and e-cigarette use is in the past 30 days
- **Binge drinking** is 5 or more drinks on an occasion (males) or 4 or more for women in the past 30 days.
- Rent home includes those with other accommodations outside of owning a home.
- **Poor mental health** is defined as having 14+ days with poor mental health in the past 30 days.
- Poor general health is defined as reporting fair or poor health overall.
- Depression is defined as a diagnosis with a depressive disorder by a doctor.
- LGBTQ+ includes lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and other sexual orientations, or those
 questioning or unsure of their sexual orientation or gender identity.
