




Cardiovascular Disease (CVD) Risk Prevalence among Vermont Adults Never Diagnosed with CVD by Social Determinants of Health, 2017-2021

Data Source: Vermont Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS), 2017, 2019, 2021.

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Notes: CVD risk is defined as having 3 or more of the following: hypertension, high cholesterol, body mass index (BMI) of 25 or greater, no leisure time physical activity, current cigarette smoking or smokeless tobacco use, not having been screened for high cholesterol in the last 5 years.

Geographic regions were created specifically for this data source and these maps using a county-based spatial smoothing technique and the total number of priority population respondents to the Vermont BRFSS.

•Adults self-reporting as American Indian or Alaskan Native.

^{*}Data are suppressed due to small sample size to protect individuals privacy or a lack of statistical reliability in calculated values. ◊Any adult self-reporting as being something other than straight and heterosexual/cisgender.
