How to promote Health Department campaigns.

The Health Department works with professional marketing agencies to create research-based materials designed to appeal to various groups of Vermonters. We are happy to share our materials with you and appreciate your partnering with us to protect the health of Vermonters. It is important that the images and materials provided to you are used as designed and for their intended purpose. For example, social media images are low resolution and cannot be enlarged to be bus ads. Maintaining the consistency of the look and style of each campaign enhances its recognition and impact. Sharing posts directly from the Health Department's social media is encouraged.



Images & Videos

- Use only images and videos provided with this guidance.
 - Do not manipulate images and videos.
 - Maintain colors, aspect ratio and image quality.
 - Text within images and videos cannot be edited.
- Do not use components or logos to create new items.
- Provided images cannot be used for other print or marketing purposes (no bus ads, commercials, etc.).



Message Text

- Do not edit message text.
- · Local information can be added.
- Message text can be included in newsletters and partner outreach.
- Additional approved text can be found on campaign webpages. These statements can be used to enhance messaging to audiences and partners.
- Information included with campaign text cannot be contradictory to Health Department messaging.



Print Materials

- Newspaper ads are provided in different sizes.
- Do not print campaign materials or images.
- Print materials are available for free through the Vermont Alcohol and Drug Information Clearinghouse (VADIC).
