There could be lessons learned from this work.</li> <li>Potential use of addition funding for prevention:         <ul> <li>Post overdose outreach connected with law enforcement agencies</li> <li>Utilize additional funding to stabilize the current funding structure in prevention (long term goal)</li> <li>Potential to use some of the ARPA funds to expand communications work to meet previously identified communications gaps</li> <li>Putting resources toward strategic planning for the potential for ongoing collaboration between prevention and overdose prevention work and streamlining this work across the spectrum</li> <li>The inventory noted only 50% of the programming captured in this report are identified as evidence based, could funding go to expand this percentage to be higher</li> </ul> </li> <li>What do we need to move towarda comprehensive prevention system in Vermont         <ul> <li>There may be more collaborations happening, for example in overdose prevention, that we are not aware of, so is there an opportunity to highlight more of the collaborations that we currently have happening</li> <li>This could also develop a network of "prevention ambassadors" who naturally bring prevention into all of their conversations and ensure prevention has a spot at multiple tables which will maximize our funding overall. This can be completed through current work, just reframing how the work is talked about.</li> <li>An opportunity for ADAP and the Tobacco Control Program to be less separate; they are current collaborative but the way the work happens is separate when working with the same partners on the ground.</li> <li>Funding could be a potential issue for this as there are different federal funding streams</li> <li>Ensuring we</li></ul></li></ul>
