Exploring through SEOW and creating a sustainable way of tracking disposal options through the mapping project. • Increase % of controlled substances: change to “monitor % of controlled substance”. Depending on statewide efforts along with prescribing patterns to reduce the number of controlled substances prescribed. • Baseline assessment of what already exists for public awareness: Hilary working on a map of where disposal drop box sites are at pharmacies and Law Enforcement. – Megan Trutor to explain communication campaigns around proper use of Rx drugs and proper disposal of Rx drugs - in conjunction with what we are doing the communications will also have a campaign. – The Past 4-5 years the State has had a Federal grant and utilized funding to promote Take Back Days and a campaign, “Vermont’s Most Dangerous Leftovers”. • Mariann will follow up with Megan to attend a meeting with an update on communications. • Pharmacy – what level of support to provide? Look at money that will be approved, what is the commitment to the pharmacy? Assisting with the purchase of kiosk, provide funding for a year, liners – assistance must have a sustainable way to continue. Suggestion for ongoing cost - possibly a graduated responsibility of the pharmacist would match the dollars or put in some of the cost and eventually be responsible.

				<p>2nd goal – Increase Law Enforcement Participation in Prescription Drug Disposal Initiatives</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Technical assistance support long-term <p>3rd goal – Increase Pharmacy, Hospital, Long Term Care Facility Participation in Prescription Drug Disposal Initiatives.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sending out a survey for hospitals and long term care facilities • Becoming a disposal site is a red flag with residential long term care facilities, does this cause any security issues related to protecting vulnerable individuals? • If Hospital and Long term care facilities couldn't implement the disposal system possibly do follow up information to patients of where to dispose medication. • Possible add another goal - Communication and engagement beyond the pharmacies such as long term care facilities and hospitals.

Assess how much usage does disposal get; high usage pharmacies might want to expand or low usage pharmacies help us understand why they wouldn't want to expand options.
