Wall units installed at different locations Barre City Hall rest rooms St. Albans Health Dept. Notch Health Care Center, Enosburgh Falls Pilot project with the City of Barre: Installing larger kiosk around the city that would take single deposit syringe, auto injector and containers. Issues that the city of Barre are having with Sharps are: Finding them in parks, public rest rooms, mailboxes and waste water treatment facilities

 Deputy Chief Joe Aldsworth spearheaded pilot project. Postal carriers are trained on how to pick up sharps safely and were provided containers to dispose of. Partnered with Local State offices, Corrections, Public Safety, BGS, Local Housing, City
 Hall, Park and Recreation, Solid Waste For 30 days, a 3-gallon container was placed next to the Drug Take Back Unit and filled up quickly.
