

Radioactive Materials Fee Schedule

License Application Fees

Each application must be accompanied by a payment for the full amount of the fee. The Vermont Department of Health will not begin the process to issue a new license before receiving the application fee.

- The application fee is charged whether the Department approves the application or not. The application fee is also charged if the applicant withdraws the application.
- If an applicant submits a request for a license whose description or program code does not correspond to a proposed license type or program code, the applicant must submit information to the Health Department for proper classification of the license type, program code and associated fee.
- If an applicant applies for a license that involves more than one fee type/license category, the application fee will be the sum of all fees for each fee type/license category.
- Applications for new materials licenses; applications to reinstate expired, terminated, or inactive licenses; and applications for amendments to materials licenses that would place the license in a higher fee category or add a new fee category must be accompanied by payment of the application fee for each category.
- Applications for new licenses that cover both byproduct material and special nuclear material in sealed sources for use in gauging devices need to pay the fee under 1C only.
- Licensees paying fees under 3C are not subject to fees under 2B for possession and shielding authorized on the same license.
- Licensees paying fees under 7C are not subject to fees under 2B for possession and shielding authorized on the same license.
- Licensees paying fees under 3N are not subject to paying fees under 3P for calibration or leak testing services authorized on the same license.
- Licensees paying fees under 7B are not subject to paying fees under 7C for broad scope licenses issued under 10 CFR Parts 30, 35, 40, and 70 for human use of byproduct material, source material, and/or special nuclear material—except licenses for byproduct material, source material, or special nuclear material in sealed sources contained in teletherapy devices authorized on the same license.

- A materials license (or part of a materials license) that transitions to fee category 14A is assessed full-cost fees but is not assessed an annual fee. If only part of a materials license is transitioned to fee category 14A, the licensee may be charged annual fees for other activities authorized under the license that are not in decommissioning status.

Annual Fees

Annual fees for radioactive materials are assessed on the anniversary date of the license and must be paid within thirty days of annual fee invoicing.

- If a person holds more than one license, certificate, registration or approval, the annual fee(s) will be assessed for each license, certificate, registration or approval held by that person.
- If a single license authorizes more than one activity (for example, human use and irradiator activities), annual fees will be assessed for each fee category applicable to the license.
- If a person holds more than one license, the total annual fee assessed will be the cumulative total of the annual fees applicable to each license held.

Exemptions

No application fees, license fees, or renewal fees shall be required for:

- A special request or report submitted to the Vermont Department of Health
- A license applied for by, or issued to, a non-profit educational institution and/or a state funded educational institution for the possession and use of byproduct material, source material, or special nuclear material.

This exemption does not apply to those byproduct, source or special nuclear material licenses which authorize:

1. Human use
2. Remunerated services to other persons
3. Distribution of byproduct material, source material, or special nuclear material. products containing byproduct material, source material or special nuclear material.
4. Activities performed under a government agency contract.

The Health Department will review and grant or deny exemption requests. The Health Department may upon application by an interested person, or upon its own initiative, grant such exemptions from the regulations, as it determines are authorized by law or are otherwise in the public interest. Applications for exemptions may include activities such as, but not limited to, the use of licensed material for education or noncommercial public displays or scientific collections.
