

The Vermont Department of Health is working with pharmacies and the CDC to ensure all long term care facilities (LTCF) have continued access to the COVID-19 vaccine and this document provides current options and resources. After the CDC's Federal Pharmacy Partnership for LTCF Program ended, facilities were instructed to establish a direct relationship with a pharmacy partner to access COVID-19 vaccines going forward. To prepare for FDA authorization of a booster vaccine dose, most facilities should have established a relationship with a pharmacy where residents and staff can receive COVID-19 vaccine booster doses. If you have not established a relationship with a pharmacy, choose one of the following options.

Options to obtain COVID-19 Booster Doses:

- Work with your existing pharmacy partner
- Establish contact with a new pharmacy partner
- Utilize Community Clinics and Retail Pharmacies for mobile residents

Work with your existing pharmacy partner

Some of you have (or are in the process of entering) an arrangement with a pharmacy to provide booster doses to your facility, and/or for the pharmacy to come to your facility and administer the vaccine. Please continue to use the already established reliable distribution and administration systems that you have in place for obtaining COVID-19 booster vaccines. The goal is to have a fast and efficient way for individuals in LTCFs to get vaccinated if they need a primary series or a booster dose of COVID-19 vaccine. There continues to be a strong supply of FDA authorized vaccines and this is the preferred option for access to COVID-19 booster doses.

Establish contact with a new pharmacy partner

If you do not have an established relationship with a pharmacy, or your pharmacy partner is not providing COVID-19 vaccines, please contact one of the pharmacies on the list below who may be willing to support booster doses at your facility.

Utilize Community Clinics and Retail Pharmacies for mobile residents:

If your residents are mobile and can be transported, the next preferred option for vaccinating residents and staff is by registering for the vaccine at a community clinic through the <u>state's</u> <u>portal</u> or through a retail pharmacy. Many retail pharmacies are offering vaccines. Most patients and staff can be registered directly through their websites. Links to their websites can also be found on the State's portal at the link above.

Additional reminders:

Testing: The Vermont Department of Health continues to partner with CIC Health to offer COVID-19 testing at many sites in Vermont. If you have previously tested with CIC Health under Vermont's COVID-19 testing program, restarting is easy. Simply complete <u>this brief form</u> to notify CIC Health of your intent to restart your program. You may then begin testing immediately at the cadence defined in the guidelines put forth by the State of Vermont for the long-term care facility testing program.
