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
### **Monthly Suicide Report**

November 2022

#### Summary of 2022 Suicide Deaths (to date): 93 As of the end of August, the number of suicide deaths in 2022 is higher compared to previous 79 years, but it is not statistically significant. Suicide among those who are Black, Indigenous, or a Person of Color (BIPOC) is higher compared to previous years. There has been 5 deaths among the BIPOC community,

### The number of Vermonters who have died by suicide this year is higher than previous years.





#### Suicide death rates by county of residence, through August




The number of pending death certificates are deaths that have not been assigned a cause of death in Vermont Vital Statistics. Death certificates that are pending are not necessarily suicide deaths. There are 16 pending death certificates in 2022.

#### Summary of 2022 Suicide-Related Emergency Department Visit Data (to date):

- During the first three months of 2022, the rate of suicide-related visits were higher compared to the corresponding months previous years.
- The rate of suicide-related ED visits in September 2022 was nearly the same as September in previous years and nearly the same rate as suicide-related ED visits in August 2022.



# ED visit rates for suicidal ideation by county of residence, through September 2022.


ED Visit Rates per 10,000 visits


## ED visit rates for suicidal ideation and self-directed violence by sex and age group, through September 2022.
