## Notice of Change in the Vermont Vaccine Program

Vaccines Urgent Care Facilities and Home Health Agencies are now eligible to enroll in <u>the</u> <u>Vermont Vaccine Program (VVP)</u>. The state Immunization Program purchases vaccines from the CDC federal contract and provides them at no cost to practices, for use in children (0-18) and adults (19-64). To receive state supplied vaccines, an eligible practice must enroll in the Vermont Child Vaccine Program (VCVP) and/or Vermont Adult Vaccine Program (VAVP) programs.

\*Change in policy – Urgent care facilities or Home health agencies may be designated as a "Specialty Provider" and only order/administer flu vaccine. They will no longer be required to carry all recommended pediatric vaccines.

As a reminder the Vermont Immunization Program does not provide vaccine storage units (refrigerators and freezers), however all enrolled practices receive state supplied continuous temperature monitoring devices (SensoScientific data loggers), including calibration and maintenance.
