We would like to congratulate you on the excellent progress your school has made in helping to make sure students are protected from vaccine preventable diseases. Overall in the 2019-2020 school year, <u>95.1% of Vermont students from kindergarten through 12th grade met all</u> immunization requirements. This is the highest level reported in Vermont since this data was first collected in 2012. Additionally, the percentage of students who were provisionally enrolled decreased from 2.3% to 1.7% in the past year, demonstrating the effectiveness of your efforts to reduce provisional admittance. Non-medical exemptions were also lower at 3% for all students and 3.5% for those entering kindergarten. Having so many children fully immunized creates the level of "community immunity" that we need to keep diseases from spreading.

Your efforts, together with so many other schools, child cares, and health care providers around Vermont, help keep children safe at a time when the importance of vaccines is more evident than ever. As the world navigates the COVID-19 pandemic, it is encouraging to know that our communities value the important role of immunizations. Now we must sustain these efforts, so this progress is not lost.

Unfortunately, the uncertainty of these times has already led to a decrease in vaccines administered in the last few months. This is concerning, and we cannot afford to backslide. You can help by encouraging your school community to keep children current with vaccines. Remind parents and guardians about the important role vaccines play in protecting their children's health. Encourage families of newly enrolled students and those who are provisionally enrolled to get their children up to date on all vaccines in the next three months. Remind them that the <u>school entry requirements</u> will be enforced in the fall to prevent vaccine preventable disease outbreaks.
